Amendments to the Public Procurement Act & the Public Procurement Regulations

As you are aware amendments have been brought to the Public Procurement Act through the Additional Stimulus Package (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 2009 and The Finance (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 2009.

2. Following the said amendments, the Public Procurement Regulations 2008 have been amended as per G.N. 86 of 2009.

3. The amendments brought to the Public Procurement Act through the Finance (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 2009 and to the Regulations are reproduced at Annex 1(a) and 1(b).

4. The tables at Annex II(a) and II(b) show the existing provisions and the new provisions, and also the implications of the amendments.

5. Moreover, the First Schedule to Public Procurement Regulations 2008 has been revoked and replaced as reproduced at Annex III.

- (c) in section 7 -
 - (i) in paragraph (da), by inserting, before the words "public bodies", the words "the Board and";
 - (ii) by inserting, after paragraph (da), the following new paragraph
 - (db) attend to complaints from bidders or suppliers and advise the Board or public bodies on the appropriate course of action;
- (d) in section 7A(1)(a), by inserting, after the word "from", the words "the Board or";
- (e) in section 11(1)(d), by deleting the words "and independent";

THE PUBLIC PROCUREMENT ACT

Regulations made by the Minister under section 61 of the Public Procurement Act

1. These regulations may be cited as the Public Procurement (Amendment No. 3) Regulations 2009.

2. In these regulations –

"principal regulations" means the Public Procurement Regulations 2008.

3. Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is amended –

- (a) in paragraph (2), by deleting the words "and independent";
- (b) in paragraph (3), by revoking subparagraph (a), the existing subparagraph (3)(b) being renumbered (3).

4. Regulation 35 of the principal regulations is amended –

(a) by deleting the heading and replacing it by the following heading –

Margin of preference

(b) in paragraph (1), by deleting the words "materials, if any," and replacing them by the words ", domestic and foreign contractors,".

5. Regulation 38 of the principal regulations is amended by adding after paragraph (2), the following new paragraph –

(3) For the purposes of section 40(3) of the Act, the prescribed threshold shall be 15 million rupees.
